

Title: Business Risk Management: A Technician’s View (A workshop that will introduce Technicians to business risk management concepts in a technical workplace.)	
Overview / Session Description	<p>This online workshop session will provide an introduction into how organisations manage risk and how this could apply to a Technician’s workplace.</p> <p>The session will answer the question “What is risk?” and “What is risk management?” It will provide an opportunity to develop the Technician’s understanding of business risks – how this is enacted in their technical workplace and how this fits with the big picture of their organisation (strategy, contingency planning, risk management framework). The course will equip Technicians with skills to do their own risk analysis work.</p>
